What Happens Now?

Since April of 2020, CRNA, APN-Anesthesia and other Advanced Practice Nurses have successfully and safely worked without the restrictions of the Joint Protocol.

Now, we are working together to convince the legislature and the Governor that removal of the Joint Protocol should be made permanent.

This will protect the flexibility that facilities have gained to select the anesthesia providers that best fit their care needs, and allows CRNA and APN-Anesthesia providers have a greater choice of practice environments.

Ultimately, this will improve access to affordable anesthesia services and access to other healthcare services for New Jersey residents.
